Biographical Sketch: Iona Victoria Campagnolo (née Hardy) was born in Vancouver, B.C on October 18, 1932 to Rosamond and Kenneth Hardy. Soon thereafter, little Iona – still a babe in arms - and her family returned to Galiano Island to her family home. Along with her three siblings, John, Harold and Marion, she was raised to be proud of her family's pioneering roots: their grandfather, Finlay Murcheson, settled on the Island in 1882.

In 1940, the Hardy family moved up the coast to the North Pacific Cannery located on the Skeena River near Prince Rupert, where her father worked as Chief of Maintenance. On August 9, 1952 she married (and later divorced) Louis Campagnolo, and together they had two daughters. It was out of a concern for the quality of her daughters' education that Iona Campagnolo first became involved with municipal politics: first being elected to the Prince Rupert School Board in 1966 where she served for six years as School Trustee, Chairman of the Board, and North Coast Zone Chairman of the Board. Upon completion of her term on the School Board, she ran in the Prince Rupert civic election, won, and served a term as 'Alderman' (City Councilor) until 1974. Also during this period (1965-1974) Iona Campagnolo was working for CHTK Radio, Skeena Broadcasters Ltd., as both Advertising Sales Director and Broadcaster: her prowess at the latter position earned her a *B.C. Broadcaster of the Year* award in 1973.

The early seventies were not only a time of political activism for Iona Campagnolo, they were also a time of continued community activism and development of ethno-cultural initiatives within the City of Prince Rupert that had originally begun almost twenty years earlier in 1954. In 1971 Iona Campagnolo was appointed the Royal Visit Co-ordinator for the City of Prince Rupert a task which saw her organize the Centennial Royal Visit of the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh accompanied by the Princess Anne to the City as part of their Royal Tour of British Columbia, May 3-12, 1971. As producer, director and costume designer for many performances of the North Pacific Players (a Prince Rupert theatre company) Iona Campagnolo was intrinsically involved in several community theatre performances such as *Man of La Mancha* (1971), *Mary Stuart* (1972) *Tom Jones* (1973) and *Fiddler on the Roof* (1974). In 1973 she was charged with the task of organizing the Vice Regal visit of Governor General and Mme Roland Michener to the City of Prince Rupert and in 1974, she was appointed Co-ordinator, Northwest Region for *Folkfest '74* – the first of such cultural celebrations to embrace, promote and celebrate diversity in British Columbia's North Coastal region. To acknowledge and honour her 20 years of dynamic volunteerism within her community, she was made a Member of the *Order of Canada* in 1973 and was promoted to Officer in 2008.

In 1974 Iona Campagnolo turned her attention to federal politics. Running as a Liberal Party candidate for the riding of Skeena, she won this election and ousted long standing Skeena MP Frank Howard. As Member of Parliament for Skeena, Iona Campagnolo first served as Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development (1974-1976). She was then appointed a Cabinet Member in Pierre Trudeau's government – a position which subsequently granted her the portfolio of Minister of State for Fitness and Amateur Sport (Sept. 14, 1976 – May 22, 1979). Not only did this new

appointment grant her the distinction of becoming the very *first* Minister of Amateur Sport in Canada, she also became the first woman *and* Northerner to be appointed a federal Minister. Iona Campagnolo and Monique Begin were the fourth and fifth women in Canadian History to enter the Federal Cabinet, and were appointed together by Mr. Trudeau on September 16, 1976 to the Privy Council, following in the footsteps of Ellen Fairclough (the John Diefenbaker government); Judy LaMarsh (the Lester Pearson government) and Jeanne Sauvé (the Pierre Trudeau government).

During her three years in office, Iona Campagnolo was responsible for creating and developing a policy on amateur sport and fitness for the federal government. Ms. Campagnolo's major achievements in this area included a *National Policy on Amateur Sport*, *Canada's Hosting Policy* and a *National Policy on Fitness*. She commissioned studies to be undertaken to assess the status of both international and amateur hockey in Canada. A report on International Hockey and an interim report on Minor Amateur Hockey in Canada. She was made accountable to Parliament for the operation of three Crown Corporations – Loto Canada, *Participation* and the National Sport and Recreation Administration Center. She initiated International Sport Exchanges with Eastern Bloc Countries to enhance Canadian sport technical expertise following our Nations' 10th place finish in the 1976 Montreal Olympics. She played a key role in the development of the Canada Games and presided as Minister to these Games at St. John's, Newfoundland in 1977 and at Brandon, Manitoba in 1979; as Minister to the Arctic Winter Games at Hay River and Pine Point, N.W.T. in 1978; and as Minister to the Commonwealth Games at Edmonton, Alta. in 1978. Ms. Campagnolo entered into negotiations for sport development exchanges between Canada and several African and Caribbean Nations during the Commonwealth Games with a view to enhancing the sport expertise of Commonwealth partners. During her years as M.P. Ms. Campagnolo was an active participant and served on various Standing Committees of the House of Commons on Energy, Environment and Fisheries, Privileges and Elections, Indian Affairs and Northern Development, and the Cabinet Oceans Committee on Law of the Sea.

After electoral defeat in the May 1979 federal election, Iona Campagnolo embarked upon several years of active involvement within the public, private and non-profit realms. Ms. Campagnolo served for two years (1979-1981) as host of a prime time feature interview program on the CBC, from Vancouver, titled "One of a Kind". During the first three months of 1981, Ms. Campagnolo completed an assignment by the Secretary of State for External Affairs, to organize the founding and incorporation of the "Future's Secretariat", a domestic development awareness mechanism, structured from the various sectors of Canadian Society in which Labour Unions and Business, Women's Groups and Co-operatives, churches and Business / Investment / Banking and Service Clubs are provided with consultative forum in which to gain access to and participate in, the cause of International Development Cooperation. The intended result was to be a series of community Task Forces and network linkages at the local level, which would raise the consciousness of Canadians to the interdependent nature of the world and Canada's role and responsibility to it. The Futures Secretariat also organized a unique interaction with representatives of the media to provide a climate of greater understanding of issues surrounding international development cooperation.

Working as a consultant on Public Relations and Fundraising to CUSO-VSO (then known only as CUSO or the Canadian University Services Overseas Organization) Iona Campagnolo undertook a large number of speaking engagements particularly in support of refugee re-development, with emphasis on Thai-Kampuchean Border refugees. After spearheading the raising of more than half a million dollars in 1980 towards this particular campaign, she continued to work on various other campaigns on behalf of CUSO. Iona Campagnolo was also a Special Projects Consultant to the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA). In 1981 she was appointed Project Head by the Deputy Minister of Agriculture, S.B. Peterson, of the World Food Day Fast: "How does it feel to be hungry?" to organize this awareness raising event in Vancouver, October 12-16, 1981.

Iona Campagnolo also devoted much time to feminist initiatives. In 1980 Iona Campagnolo became involved with the Jerusalem Women's Seminar and Intercultural Dialogue and traveled to Jerusalem, Israel to attend the Jerusalem Women's Seminar - an international, intercultural program for high-level women policy-makers from Canada, US, Israel and Egypt, to promote cultural exchange and professional networking during the Camp David Accords. Ms. Campagnolo also assisted in the organization and emergence of women's networks in several Canadian urban centers such as Edmonton and Vancouver.

Also from 1979-1981 Ms. Campagnolo acted as Special Consultant in several different capacities to Simon Fraser University (SFU). First, through the Active Health Sciences Division of the Kinesiology Department at SFU she worked to found a National Team Development Centre for high performance sport. She was also involved with the University's Scientific Research Park, student and faculty exchanges with the People's Republic of China, and in the development of a minor degree in Athletic Coaching at SFU.

In January of 1981, Ms. Campagnolo was guest lecturer to senior-level students in the Sport Administration Degree program at Laurentian University in Sudbury, Ont. where she spoke on the involvement of various levels of government in sport development.

During this inter-political period, Ms. Campagnolo was also a consultant to the Calgary Olympic Development Association, assisting them with their bid for the 1988 Winter Olympics, through personal contact with members of the international sport community, including presenting Calgary's bid to IOC (International Olympic Committee) members in Africa and Europe.

In 1982 Iona Campagnolo once again heard the call from the political realm and stood for election this time for the position of President of the Liberal Party of Canada. She was elected to this position by a Party Convention on November 7, 1982 as the first woman President of the Liberal Party of Canada, after 50 years of male predecessors. In the September 1984 federal election Iona Campagnolo made one last run at federal politics when she ran in the North Vancouver-Burnaby riding. She was, however, defeated in the Mulroney landslide victory that reduced John Turner's Liberals down to 40 seats. Also in 1984, she served as National Co-Chair of the Liberal Leadership Convention, and was re-elected to the office of President by acclamation at this June 1984 Convention. Ms. Campagnolo served in this capacity until November 27, 1986.

In 1986 Iona Campagnolo began working on contract with Contemporary Communications for the National Speakers Bureau. Writing and delivering speeches across the country to a myriad of organizations from the Canadian Red Cross Society in Hamilton Ont. to the YMCA 'Women in Management' Conference in Edmonton Alta. to the Financial Management Institute of Canada Conference in Whistler, B.C. She actively served in this capacity until 1996, finally resigning from her position in May of 2001.

From 1987-1990 Iona Campagnolo, as Associate Director, worked towards the establishment and development of the McMaster University Centre for International Health. In essence, the mission of this Centre is to build a partnership between the Faculty of Health Sciences researchers, educators and clinicians, funding agencies and global development initiatives to commit university research and education to the service for people's health worldwide for the mutual benefit of science, health, clinical practice and human development.

In 1992, Iona Campagnolo became actively involved with the establishment and development of a new university in northern British Columbia – the University of Northern British Columbia (UNBC) in Prince George. On May 23, 1992 she was appointed the founding Chancellor of the University – an academic institution in the heart of her beloved North and for which she quoted J.R.R. Tolkien: "This is the hour of

the north people, when we arise from our quiet forests to shake the towers and counsels of the Great.” As Chancellor until 1998, Iona Campagnolo made a point of personally visiting each region, and each community within, served by UNBC, these *Chancellor’s Tours* included: the Northwest region: Burns Lake to Haida Gwaii (1992); the Northeast region: Peace River to Ft. St. John to Ft. Nelson (1993); The Northwest region: Smithers to Kispiox, Kitimat, Terrace and Prince Rupert (1994); the South-Central region: Quesnel to Alkali Lake (1995); and the Northern region: Highway 37, Kitwanga to Atlin (1996).

In 1995 Iona Campagnolo became a Director (1995-1996) and then Chair (1996-1997) of the Fraser Basin Management Program (FBMP). Established in 1992 under the auspices of federal, provincial and local governments, the Fraser Basin Management Program (FBMP) worked towards bringing together all four orders of Canadian government (federal, provincial, municipal and First Nations) with the private sector and civil society to address some of the key river management issues identified by Fraser River Action Plan - a part of Canada’s Green Plan. The FBMP also developed a strategic plan for the sustainability of the entire Fraser River Basin. In 1997, the FBMP was succeeded by the Fraser Basin Council (FBC) and Iona Campagnolo was appointed its founding Chair. The mandate of the FBC is to bring people together to solve complex, multi-jurisdictional issues in the Fraser Basin, to take advantage of opportunities, and to strengthen the capacity of institutions and individuals to deal with emerging issues that threaten the overall sustainability of the Basin. The FBC is a not-for-profit society and carries out its mandate by working with the vision, principles, and goals outlined in their *Charter for Sustainability*. The FBC is funded by contributions from the federal, provincial and local governments in the Fraser Basin; it also receives funding from corporate, individual and foundation donors. In all its activities, the FBC remains impartial, trans-partisan, independent and non-political in its primary role as an advocate for a sustainable Basin. Iona Campagnolo served as Chair of the FBC until 2001.

On September 21, 2001, Iona Campagnolo was appointed by Governor General Adrienne Clarkson in the name of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, on the advice of Prime Minister Jean Chrétien, as British Columbia’s *first* female Lieutenant Governor. The Lieutenant Governor is the representative of Her Majesty, The Queen of Canada in the Province of British Columbia, and as such, takes precedence over everyone in the province except the Sovereign. The Lieutenant Governor personifies the Crown, which is both the apex and the unifying link in the constitutional and political structure of the province — executive, legislative, and judicial. All legislation must receive Royal Assent before it becomes law. It must therefore be signed by the Lieutenant Governor. All Orders-In-Council and official proclamations are also signed by the Lieutenant Governor in the name of The Queen.

The prime responsibility of the Lieutenant Governor is to ensure that at all times there is a First Minister in the province and, after the selection of the First Minister, any time when the position is vacant because of death or resignation, or after defeat in a provincial election, or as a result of a non-confidence motion in the Legislature, the Lieutenant Governor must either dissolve the House or call upon someone else to become First Minister and try to form a viable government. The Lieutenant Governor, although not elected to speak for the majority in our democratic Parliamentary system, cannot wield political power in practice; however the Lieutenant Governor is the source of the power of the government of the day. Although the government in office can decide how the power of the state is to be used, that power never really passes to the government — it always remains with the Crown. Thus the power of the state is held in a non-partisan office, above the conflicts and divisions of the political process, and as a consequence it is a unifying force because it represents equally all of the elements which make up the state. The Office of Lieutenant Governor is also understood as a centre for a fully Canadian interpretation of the history, strengths and potential of the province being represented, or in the case of the Governor General, that of Canada itself.

As Lieutenant Governor, Iona Campagnolo attended many dinners, cultural events, military and civilian ceremonies; opened buildings and conferences; addressed gatherings of various kinds, visited schools,

community events, and military establishments and hosted royalty, and dignitaries from around the world. By the end of her term, she had made more than 2,000 such presentations at an average of 320 events yearly: 190 of which having been held at Government House on an annual basis, with the rest taking place in the Province at large. She served as British Columbia's 27th Lieutenant Governor until September 30, 2007.

Since 2007, the Honourable Iona Campagnolo has remained actively involved with two key issues: reconciling Aboriginal Rights and Title with Crown Title, and salmon sustainability in collaboration with the faculty of Continuing Studies in Science at Simon Fraser University. She currently makes her home on Vancouver Island.

Honours & Awards: In 1973 Iona Campagnolo was named *B.C. Broadcaster of the Year*. That same year she was made a Member of the *Order of Canada*, for her previous 20 years of community volunteerism, and was promoted to Officer in 2008. In 1998 she received the *Order of British Columbia*.

In 1976 she became a sworn Member of the *Queen's Privy Council*, an honour which henceforth entitled her to the lifetime usage of the title: "The Honourable". In 1977 The Honourable Iona Campagnolo received the *Queen's Jubilee Medal* and in 1992 she received *The Canada 125 Medal*. She became an

Honourary Life Member of The Liberal Party of Canada (B.C.) in 1998 and in 2003 she was granted armorial bearings by the Chief Herald of Canada.

The Honourable Iona Campagnolo has received Honorary Doctor of Laws (LL.D.) from six universities including: Simon Fraser University (1995), Brock University (1997), University of Northern British Columbia (1999), University of Victoria (2007), University of British Columbia (2009) and Trent University (2009).

Iona Campagnolo has been honoured with First Nations names from both the T'simpsean and Haida peoples. In 1973 Chief Haq-ba-quo-too (Kenneth Harris) of the T'simpsean people, granted her the name: *Noltz-whe-neha* or "Mother of the Big Fin". In 1976, Chief Skidegate (Clarence Collinson) bestowed upon her the Haida name of *Saan aag X's'wah* or "Person Who Sits High".

An ardent gardener herself, the Honourable Iona Campagnolo also has two rhododendrons named in her honour. *R. 'Iona Cee'* ('Haida Gold' · 'Golden Star') is Courtenay nurseryman Harry Wright's creation. *R. 'Iona Campagnolo'* ('Etta Burrows' · ('Anna' · 'Fusilier')) was grown from Royal Horticultural Society seed in 1981 by Jean Round of the Vancouver Chapter of the Rhododendron Society and raised at Alouette Nursery in the Fraser Valley.

Audiocassette - Tape Summary

Scope and Content: Item consists of one audio recording of a taped radio show *Perspective* by CFUV Radio University of Victoria by Mahinder Doman with Iona Campagnolo in July 1987. Campagnolo discusses a variety of subjects related to her professional career including memories of her early years in municipal politics; her entry into federal politics and as a member of the federal Liberal caucus; her views on feminism and on being a female politician; her impact as the Federal Minister of Sports under the Trudeau government; the John Turner 'bum-patting' controversy; contemporary issues facing the Liberal Party in the 1980s and provides commentary on the Mulroney government and Liberal leadership of John Turner. Other issues discussed are the Canadian political scene in 1987: the rise of extreme right wing politics internationally; the prospects of the Liberals in the next federal election; the impact of the Meech Lake Accord; Northern Canadian territories and self-government; the impact of the free trade issue; the campaign for a national child care program; Canadian immigration policy; the position of the lieutenant within Quebec for the Prime Minister. Campagnolo also talks about her upcoming new position at McMaster University to assist in the creation of an international health care facility in relation to Third World countries.

00"-19" recording starts with taped music

20"-1'33" Radio Announcer Mahinder Doman introduces the radio show *Perspective* which runs each Sunday night from 6:00-8pm hosted by her or Jeff Richman [sp?]. Ms. Doman introduces tonight's guest Ms. Iona Campagnolo who she notes has been an MP and who has recently joined the faculty at the University of McMaster, in Hamilton Ontario

1'34"-2'00" Ms. Doman introduces Iona Campagnolo and thanks her for agreeing to be interviewed and for coming to Victoria to be on the show. Ms. Campagnolo interjects that she was visiting Victoria at the same time and had participated in the David Foster Variety Show, a fundraiser which she notes benefits the community of Victoria.

2'02" Ms. Doman asks Ms. Campagnolo when and what influenced her decision to embark upon a political career?

2'17"-4'30" Ms. Campagnolo accounts briefly that she just didn't enter federal politics overnight; that she had started in politics at the municipal level initially in Prince Rupert when she joined the school board as a school trustee when she was in her early thirties. She had decided to join the school board as she didn't think the education her children were receiving in Prince Rupert was as adequate as the system in southern BC and that this was 'unfair'. She later became an 'alderman' with the City of Prince Rupert [she notes that in those days the position title was assumed to be masculine; women were not 'alderwoman']. She recalls that she was also at the same time working as a broadcaster on a daily talk show for a private radio company in Prince Rupert and explains that much later she hosted a talk show entitled 'One of a Kind' on television

4'27" Ms. Doman asks Ms. Campagnolo if she injected a lot of political discussion on her radio program.

4'32" Ms. Campagnolo replies no, but notes she interviewed a lot of people from diverse walks of life from Chief Dan George to visiting evangelists, musicians, theatre workers and recalls in the 1960s interviewing hippies, peace people – those who were moving away from the Vietnam War. She recalls she interviewed regularly on her radio show the local politician Mr. Frank Howard who was her political predecessor; she had been approached to run for political office at that time by the Liberal Party and she decided that she could do the job as well as Mr. Howard, so she decided to run against Mr. Howard in an election and won in 1974.

5'46" Ms. Doman asks her Ms. Campagnolo where else did her support come from when there were few women on the political scene.

6'00" Ms. Campagnolo notes that her support in particular came from the people in the fishing and mining resource communities within Northern BC and notes it helped [to have a female politician in BC] as there was a New Democrat Party in power in BC at that time. She jokes however that there was no such thing as a federal election in BC at that time that all elections are 'provincial elections'

6'38" Ms. Doman asks her to describe for us some of the difficulties she faced being a new federal female in politics.

6'46" Ms. Campagnolo recalls it was really only her own point of view as a difficulty; as there weren't many woman in politics in Northern BC and that if you wanted to take on the job [of being in politics] you could do the job. Therefore she had always thought of herself as 'an absolute equal' however in federal politics in Ottawa it was different. Ms. Campagnolo recalls how at that time there was only 9 women in federal politics and that she now found herself having to take on positions relating to feminist issues that she had never considered. She had always felt before that if she had 'advantaged the whole family' all family members were advantaged. However she recalls at that time that she saw that 'my Eastern Sisters' had been disadvantaged and suffered inequality so she started to study many of the feminist issues and entered the feminist arena of the day.

8'12" Ms. Doman notes that Campagnolo would have the male politicians and opposition MPs to deal with and asks her were there ever any outstanding attitudes that she recalled?

8'43" Campagnolo notes that she was treated as an absolute equal – when she became a cabinet minister she didn't have a lot of ministerial experience [had been MP for only two years] but that she had been in numerous departments as Parliamentary Secretary. Campagnolo recalls that when she came into the federal cabinet she was given two 'godfathers' Marc Lalonde and Jean Chretien and that they treated her like equals. She recalls how when she use to go to make a presentation to the Prime Minster in cabinet that on many occasions Jean Chretien use to write her a little note and send it across the cabinet table and

the note would say 'shut up you've won' – she comments how we tend 'to go on too much' sometimes [laughter]

9'45" - 9'51" Ms. Doman notes they will take a brief break off the air–

9'52" *Show is back on the air* - Ms. Doman notes that during the break we were talking about the famous 'bum-patting' incidence that had occurred with the MP John Turner that had received so much attention in the media. Ms. Doman notes that feminists across the country were not pleased.

10'13" - 12'28" Ms. Campagnolo interjects that neither was she pleased about it. She recalls the incident in detail and points out initially she felt that Mr. Turner meant nothing by it either and describes it 'was a flap on the upper back hip'. However she recalls how it was played out in the media; at the time when Mr. Turner patted her she could see that it had been photographed on the CCTV camera. She notes that she immediately slapped Mr. Turner back and that too was photographed. She notes that she had a call from the media noting that they were not going to use the image and she thought that was fine as it was 'a silly matter' and it didn't mean much and that she 'got even'. However a few weeks later she noted that it happened again in the 'same jocular way' with him and so she did the same [slapped him back] and 'they ran them' [the media broadcasted it]. And she recalls that many men in cabinet said to her 'how dare you slap the Minister back' – she recalls that she responded well do you think that 'I should keep quiet? And 'that the women of Canada should keep quiet' and be told then that [such behaviour] is seen as alright? Ms. Campagnolo notes there was quite a division of opinion over it and that it became an issue during the 1984 campaign and – as an aside notes 'that campaign was not one of the better ones.' She concludes that 'over a long period of time people have put it in perspective' – and 'making it public in the end' – there are very few men [now] who would try that.

12'29" Ms. Doman remarks that it has been said that Ms Campagnolo is one of the influential [members] of the Liberal Party and asks Ms Campagnolo what is it about her political philosophy or political person that would give her that 'political clout' which has been heavily male influenced in the past?

13'01" - 14'16" Campagnolo notes that in her view 'it is a matter of credibility'; she describes women who had joined cabinet who were 'independent, credible autonomous people and self-governing personalities' who knew why they were doing this and that your philosophy is fairly well defined. She points to another 'great ally' of hers was Monique Begin who had the same kind of influence and background. She notes there were colleagues that she respected that would work with her on issues of interest. She also recalls another strategy and refers to the time when she worked with the Treasury Board for 2-1/2 years. She notes that if you found yourself 'not getting the type of support from a minister you would let him know you would like that support'. She advises that women have to use the rules to get the power to do the work for the whole society.

14'17" Ms. Doman asks whether women can create their own rules at that level of power?

14'21" Campagnolo explains that in some ways yes – but she notes to a certain extent you must remain credible and helpful to the cause; she recalls how 'I often said I was sent out to do the 'cutesy' or 'Barbie doll' kind of things'; and other women would say how could you do those kinds of things. She maintains that she believes that sometimes it was important to do those things in order to get what was needed for Western Canada, BC & Northern BC and she notes aside she would continue do that even though she hasn't represented the North for some time. She concludes it's 'a reciprocal undertaking' and you need to take a moderate stance at all times and 'not get too angry.'

15'13" Ms. Doman postulates that as a politician and having to do those "Barbie doll" kinds of [political] responsibilities and activities - that from a feminist perspective Ms. Campagnolo would have been criticized for that – she asks her what would you she say to those women?

15'30" Ms. Campagnolo responds by giving the example of when she was appointed to the position of Minister of Sports; that while it may have been seen as a "Barbie doll" kind of Ministry when Prime Minister Trudeau appointed her – it was in fact a Ministry that had been dominated previously by men. She recalls the day that she took over the Ministry of Sport and how there were jokes on the radio about this 'cute little Ministry' but Campagnolo recalls how she felt at the time – that she would give it the absolute respect that it deserved. She concludes in fact that the Ministry [with her as a head] allowed many women the opportunity to advance in sport and fitness.

16'48" Ms. Doman comments on how Mr. Trudeau is known only to appreciate 'certain kinds of women' – i.e. very intelligent or very 'unique of character' women and asks her how was that reflected throughout his cabinet at the time you were there?

17'24" - 18'50" Ms. Campagnolo remarks that 'intellectually' [Trudeau] had always 'been very superb' in dealing with feminist issues. She recalls the example of when they 'broke' the Rideau Club which had been an exclusive male club and she remembers when it had been used exclusively for receptions for the federal government. The women in caucus rose up in caucus and argued that they didn't want the tax payers' dollars being spent on a club that excluded women. She recalls that Trudeau agreed that was a good logical argument and so they moved events to Le Circle Universitaire. Campagnolo notes that this policy led to the Rideau Club changing its' policy and remarks that in fact Jean Pigott of the Conservative Party was to become its first women member. In contrast Iona refers to other exclusive male political clubs (Pat Carney's incident with the Petroleum Club in Calgary; and refers also to the Union Club in Victoria). She concludes that Trudeau made that impact and treated us as equals. Campagnolo concludes that as to Trudeau's appreciation of 'certain kinds of women' and refers to the actresses, etc. that in Campagnolo that reflects a 'personal side of him' and she notes that 'she don't make judgments of him' and concludes 'I think he was a great leader.'

18'51" Ms. Doman comments on the Liberal leadership race following Trudeau's resignation and comments that Campagnolo had chose not to enter the race. She describes that there was a lot of media attention and questions why Campagnolo chose not to enter the race when opinion polls were running so high in her favour?

19'16" - 20'48" Ms. Campagnolo notes that during that time there was an element that felt there should be a 'token female' 'for the sake of having a female contender. However she contends that she had been of the opinion that if there was a convention during her tenure as Liberal Party President she would run the Liberal Convention and make it a 'totally straight undertaking'. The party itself had come to 'rely heavily on Trudeau' and 'the party was structurally quite weak'. She felt that running the convention was more important for her to do and she kept her word that as the elected President she would do that. She summarizes that she thinks it's important that women keep their word and agree to what they promised to do. Reflecting back she notes 'yes there were a lot of flattery and talk that I was going to run and there were flowers and telegrams arriving saying I would make a good leader' but that they couldn't believe that a person would simply say no

20'49" Ms. Doman asks her if she had any regrets about that.

20'52" Ms. Campagnolo replies 'not one, I think I did the right thing'

20'53" Ms. Doman continues on however that "the people of Canada would have enjoyed having you run"

20'55" Ms. Campagnolo surmises that there was a poll run that week and recalls how 'Mr. Turner had 27 % I had 26% and Mr. Chretien had 25% and I wasn't running' [Ms. Doman laughs] so 'that was interesting' Campagnolo concludes.

21'04" Ms. Doman notes that Mr. Chretien ran a strong race against Mr. Turner and questions her - and your vote went to Mr. Turner?

21'24" Ms. Campagnolo replies 'My first vote went to Eugene Whelan – I felt that there should be one of the true Canadians who should be supported on the first ballot' –

21'36" Ms. Doman then asks - And on the second ballot?

21'38" Ms. Campagnolo notes she has 'never said who I voted for on the second ballot! [Ms. Doman laughs]

21'38" Ms. Doman points out that 'I understand you were at one time close friends with Mr. Chretien' – did that cause some difficulties?

21'53" Ms. Campagnolo reflects that 'yes' subsequently that did cause some strain in the friendship 'naturally because I was the President of the Liberal Party' and she recalls that she 'had to represent all Liberals from coast to coast to coast.' She felt that she 'had an obligation to that'. But she concludes that [since] we've seen each other and we're still friends.

22'24" Ms. Doman notes they will take a short break and then talk about when Campagnolo hosted the Webster show [Campagnolo interjects she did this last Christmas]

22'42" [The recording starts with Ms. Doman's commentary in progress discussing the Webster Show]; Ms. Campagnolo recalls that while hosting the [Jack] Webster show she had a throat infection during the first few days and people sent her remedies of how to get rid of the infection; she goes on to describe a humorous remedy recommended by a reflexologist that she tried in order to cure her sore throat and it worked.

23'39" Ms. Doman notes that McMaster University [in Hamilton, Ontario] has claimed Campagnolo and asks her – why can't you stay in BC?

23'58" - 26'05" Ms. Campagnolo replies that she'd love to but haven't received the same kind of offer. She notes that people know that 'I have donated the last 8 years of my work to Third World Countries' and explains how McMaster University is putting together an international centre for public health care in Third World Countries and they need someone to pull this together. She notes McMaster has a holistic approach to health care to care for the whole body – so she notes 'I'm happy to be there – I'm sort of the 'nose-cone' in the rocket there' – she expands that she is excited about the people I'm working with; they are already working in Bangladesh; also she notes she is national fund-raiser for CUSO and that she had spent much of last spring in West Africa. She also notes that she will also be working on an Olympic bid for Toronto and still has her speaker's tours so she is quite busy. She states however that 'I never leave BC – I always have one foot in BC'

26'06" Ms. Doman notes that Campagnolo is losing her voice [Campagnolo notes she has to clear her throat]

26'10" Ms. Doman explains that when she had mentioned to some women that Ms. Campagnolo would be here [on the show] she had synthesized two or three questions. She states that Campagnolo has been seen as a role model for some women who want to enter politics. She asks Campagnolo if she sees herself as a role model and what advice would you give those women?

26'44" Ms. Campagnolo notes 'I certainly did not see myself as a role model in the early years'; to her it was the 'pioneer feminists in Canada [in politics] were women like Therese Casgrain and Emily Murphy. She recalls that she 'never even saw myself as in the class of Judy LaMarsh because she says 'I had never suffered from inequality'. However she notes that 'gradually as time goes on - you get grey hair and you become a pioneer and you become a role model! and so then she states that she 'became conscious of it' - and then she notes 'you pay attention to being a role model because otherwise [if I make a mistake] it would harm my whole sex!

28'00" Ms. Doman comments 'Ms. Campagnolo you're beautiful – I hope we all look like you when we're older!' [*Laughter*]

28'06" Ms. Doman notes that the recent by-elections in Canada went to the NDP – she asks has the Liberal Party lost its attraction.

28'08" Ms. Campagnolo notes that presently it seems to have been the case - but she gives the example of how just a few years ago the NDP was down to 23% so these things change. Campagnolo describes how after all in [*the riding of*] Hamilton Mountain which was described as a male-oriented 'lunch bucket town' that they now have Lilly Munro as their MLA, Sheila Copps as a member, and Marion Dewar as a member and she also points out that Marion had ran against a Liberal Elizabeth Finney who came close within a 1050 votes to beating Ms. Dewar so women have done very well. Campagnolo goes on to point out that while in the Yukon the Liberals didn't have a women candidate this time but they did have the former Mayor Mr. Brannigan who came very close; and that the Liberals had former commissioner of the Yukon Iona Christenson run and almost beat Eric Neilson on one occasion. Campagnolo concludes the Liberal Party is 'not necessarily down and out' and remarks that liberal parties all over the world are suffering (a backlash) because of the 'present extreme right wing style that is in favour'; she notes that all parties go 'through cycles, eddies and back eddies of such political ideology' and refers to Ms. Thatcher as 'the absolute epitome of the breed of the right wing politician at this time' Campagnolo believes there will be a backlash and notes there is with the New Democrats coming up but maintains 'Canada does have a social conscience – it's alive and well.'

29'39" Ms. Doman asks Campagnolo what does John Turner have to do to get his party back on top of the polls.

29'47" Ms. Campagnolo believes there won't be a sweep in the next election – she predicts there will be a three way split; she comments that before the election there will be the usual - what she calls "WAC Bennett scare tactics" 'reds under the bed'... 'Watch out for the socialists' [etc] ... as we've seen in BC and she predicts the politics of BC [polarization] are the same we'll see in politics nationally 'if we're not very careful of how we make the next move'. However she notes 'that being said people are still very dissatisfied with Mr. Mulroney - that is clear' She notes the Liberals are still doing well in the polls and believes they [Liberals] can still elect a large number of people with a minority house the next time around [then] with a quick election and then we'll see who comes through.

30'35" Ms. Doman comments that there seems to be dissension under Mr. Turner within in the Liberal Party and that there have been outcries from different members of Parliament and asks what is going on?

31'07" Ms. Campagnolo comments that 'one of the fundamental philosophies of liberalism is still strong and at play; and she notes that one of the major tenets of liberalism is individualism and the right for an independent thought'

5"-7" tape recording begins with Ms. Campagnolo in mid-sentence and stops after a few seconds

8"-18" [recording is blank for about 10 seconds]

19" - 1'28" *[Recording starts again]*. Campagnolo continues discussion of the tenets of liberalism, Liberal party philosophy and also makes the connection to the Liberal Party's views historically on free trade. She points out historically to the protectionist actions by the U.S. and refers to the fact that Sir Wilfred Laurier lost an election in relation to the free trade policy in 1919 and as a side comment the issue is current for Mr. Mulroney. Campagnolo states liberalism allows for a great deal of freedom in its philosophy and for a number of opinions and that by the time of an election that there will be clear policy points for people to follow. While the elected members are not bound by those policy she comments that at the last Liberal convention there was much discussion of this from the grassroots & the rank and file party members and this can provide a direction in which the party should go.

1'29" Ms. Doman notes there is a lot of rumour that by the time of another election Mr. Turner will no longer be the leader of the Party and that it possibly could be Mr. Chretien.

1'49" - 2'42" Ms. Campagnolo notes that there is no mechanism within the party structure for that to occur; the last review of Mr. Turner got 72% and that was the view. Campagnolo believes that there was no way for him to leave the party and she thinks Mr. Turner should remain and continue to do the same things he has been doing: 'staying with the grassroots' - continue to be himself, listen to the concerns of the nation, she notes Turner has undergone a most severe and painful period of time as a leader and this time will serve him well in the future

2'41" *Ms. Doman notes they will take a short break and notes they will talk next about the Meech Lake Accord*

2'46" *Ms. Doman reiterates this is the Perspective radio show. She notes it is 6:45 pm and they are talking to Iona Campagnolo who she notes will be going off to join McMaster University. Ms. Doman then asks her what she thinks the impact of the Meech Lake Accord will be?*

3'08" Ms. Campagnolo notes it is hard to say until after it's been enforced for a while; she thinks that Section 15 of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms is an 'amazing accomplishment' to receive equal rights for women and minorities seeing that the U.S. had just denied them two years earlier. The impact will be a 'gradual strengthening of quality of provincial elected personnel' – she states the cutting edge of debate will be the premiers and they will need to seek superb negotiators who are tough in their views. She concludes that within 50 years we'll know – there will be a devolving of the brightest and best to the provincial level rather than national level.

4'32" Ms. Doman asks what's going to happen to the national standard of education and child care, health and welfare standards – will it be up to the provincial levels to 'take their share of the pie' and leave it as so?

4'51" - 5'51" Ms. Campagnolo states 'I fear that may be so' – She notes that while we hear 'there will be a child care program' she comments on the difficulty to create reasonable and costed child care. (She compares it to Judy LaMarsh's struggle to get the national pension plan). However Campagnolo points to the need for child care and the impact otherwise of the resulting problem of not creating it - and predicts that 20 or so years down the road for those children who had not received adequate care, society will have to deal with their social problems. She notes we have an obligation to provide such but it is a major question. As to the Meech Lake Accord [its'] impact won't be known for a while

5'57" Ms. Doman interjects that it [Meech Lake] brought Mr. Trudeau out fast!

5'59" - 6'44" Ms. Campagnolo states 'yes' that is so but his view is only one that history can judge; and 'there weren't people to pick up the battle'. She predicts that the Meech Lake Accord will undermine the power in Western Canada i.e. Northern Canadians particularly as she notes that NWT and Yukon that make up 60% of the landmass but have been left out of it entirely and need the rest of the provinces to agree before they can become provinces. She states also that the Yukon would be ready to become a province in the foreseeable future.

6'54" Ms. Doman asks Campagnolo if she thinks it [Meech Lake Accord] was a way for Mr. Mulroney to elevate his popularity?

6'56" Ms. Campagnolo agrees and states 'Oh yes I think it would have been very very different if he had been well up in the polls' and that Mulroney as a conciliator and union labourer he knew this was a way to improve his position in the polls – she comments about the use of polls and polls have an 'undue influence'

7'28" Ms. Doman asks how does Campagnolo think Mr. Mulroney will fair in the next election with the constitution or with the issue of capital punishment?

7'34" Ms. Campagnolo states 'People don't seem to be excited'; 'People are 'constitutioned out' – and as to capital punishment – that issue doesn't seem to be an issue – she concludes 'it's not an issue; it's gone' and that it's been dealt with by Parliament. Campagnolo comments that the issues for the next election are not yet defined but one may be free trade and Canadian sovereignty. She comments regarding free trade and interjects that it will be the major issue [for the Conservatives and Mulroney] – and as the 'great friend' of the U.S. 'I don't think they've served him very well'.

8'17" Ms. Doman asks Campagnolo if she thinks that the more recent episode of immigrants coming ashore in Nova Scotia and the government's handling of it have impacted how the parties will do in the federal election?

8'39" - 10'03" Campagnolo agrees that the arrival of the Sikh refugees has 'hardened the Canadian position' on refugee and immigration law. She notes while we don't know if they are truly refugees or not yet, Campagnolo states that from what she could see these refugees appear to be healthy and points out there were no women, no old people among them and she compares them to the poor physical condition that she has seen of refugees in other parts of the world, such as the 2.5 million refugees that she has seen in Africa. She also thinks that while it is not a 'wave of racism' it must cause 'an anger' among East Indian Canadians who see that some people are jumping the line to come to Canada when they have been waiting a long time to get their relatives into Canada.

10'07" Ms. Doman notes that Mr. Turner has taken a definite stand on that issue and says these people should be returned. Ms. Doman notes that the NDP party representative took a stand on it

10'33" Ms. Campagnolo interjects it was Nielsen Ries who had said they should be able to stay and that he [Nielsen] has said that only if they are indeed true refugees - that's the criteria

10'36" Ms. Doman asks Campagnolo whether in fact the true problem in the Immigration Department is that refugee status is not properly defined.

10'45" - 11'14" Ms. Campagnolo agrees however she notes that there are refugees desperately trying to get into Canada who are undergoing inhumane tortures and provides the example of those in Central America, examples that she knows of from her work with CUSO and by people she knows who are in Central America [with CUSO];

11'15" Ms. Doman notes that Mr. Van der Zalm has within the last few days sent a telegram to the federal government that if these people [Sikh refugees] should fall on hard times that the cost should be [promised] by the government

11'37" - 12'35" Ms. Campagnolo replies that she had an opportunity to talk about this with Mr. Van der Zalm and its' just a 'negotiating technique' [*compares his response to that on the South Moresby Park issue*]. She comments that 'I've never seen a Sikh on welfare because of their 'church structure' - the case comes down to whether they are genuine refugees or not. She believes the boat should have been inspected to see if there are other people on the boat and that [the boat] was not seen coming due to the fog.

12'36" - 13'06" Ms. Doman comments however that she had received conflicting information – noting that the Immigration Dept had been forewarned that they were coming – Campagnolo interjects that a 'pop London radio station' noted the boat was out there – however no one could find it. [Doman interjects that there are conflicting stories.] Campagnolo maintains that the issue will 'harden Canadians hearts' and make it difficult for those people who want to come to this country

13'07" Ms. Doman asks her what could be done to soften that position that has been taken by the Canadian people?

13'16" Ms. Campagnolo notes that a number of Sikh community leaders who have been interviewed and want the situation to be better and notes 'that is helpful'. Campagnolo points out that historically each group of immigrants who came to Canada and particularly to BC (she provides the examples of the Chinese in 1900, the Japanese after WWII, and the Italians after WWII as 'displaced persons') have all suffered prejudice. She comments it seems unfortunately it is the East Indian people who are suffering now and she hopes that it passes. Campagnolo summarizes that we have a lot to do to teach tolerance in this country and seeing this injustice in intolerable particularly for children. She hopes this can happen and believes that most Canadians are tolerant people.

15'02" Ms. Doman moves to another topic -- political tradition in Quebec. Doman notes that Campagnolo was explaining to her [*during the break*] about the tradition in the Liberal Party that if the leader is English-speaking the leader chooses a lieutenant in Quebec that is French-speaking.

15'16" Ms. Campagnolo explains that Mr. Turner has named a lieutenant Mr. Raymond Garneau who is French – this custom goes back to the time of Mackenzie King who didn't speak any French and therefore had Ernest LaPointe who was his lieutenant in Quebec and that it had been continued by subsequent

leaders (Louis St. Laurent, Mr. Pearson, and even Mr. Trudeau). Campagnolo points out that although there hasn't been anyone since Mr. Lalonde she hasn't discussed who would hold a future appointment under Mr. Turner

16'08" Ms. Doman asks Campagnolo if she can explain what a lieutenant does –

16'7" Ms. Campagnolo explains that a lieutenant is a political leader under the leadership of the party leader; that the lieutenant is essentially 'another arm for the leader' – Ms. Doman asks what kinds of duties they would have and Campagnolo explains the lieutenant has several duties that she describes: they deal with the fundraising issues, helping to recruit party candidates, they deal with nomination meetings, sitting on strategy committee in relation to the next election - etc.

17'08" - 17'38" Ms. Doman notes they are out of time and thanks Ms Campagnolo for coming to the interview and wishes her the best in her new role

17'39" - 18'01" Ms. Campagnolo replies that she has enjoyed the show. She extends an invitation for all university youth to enter politics in the 'party of their choice.' She also notes that she is looking forward to the 'serenity of university life' for the first time in her life starting this fall.

18'02"-18'30" Ms. Doman thanks her again. She also reiterates that Campagnolo is going to McMaster to undertake a role with the development of a new international health training care facility for health care professionals in Third World countries. Ms. Doman thanks her again and extends an invitation to come again. The show's music starts; the interview ends.

Cassini studied at the Accademia delle Belle Arti in Florence, and then designed for his mother before being hired to sketch for the design house of Jean Patou before opening his own studio. In 1936, he emigrated to the United States.</p> <p>After his arrival in the United States, Cassini worked as a costume designer for both Paramount Pictures and Twentieth-Century Fox, and dressed many of Hollywood's leading ladies. Cassini's relationship with actresses was not purely business, as he dated many, was engaged to Grace Kelly, and married Gene Tierney.</p> <p>After serving in the U.S. Army Cavalry Corps during World War II, Cassini returned to designing clothing for films, as well as for television and the theatre. He opened his own design house in 1950.</p> <p>Cassini was the official, and only, couturier of First Lady Jacqueline Kennedy. He designed over 300 outfits for her, coordinating every aspect of her wardrobe. He created the "Camelot look" just for the First Lady, and his well-crafted styles were widely copied. Women of all ages clamored for pillbox hats, geometric dresses, and boxy jackets, and Cassini also brought into widespread fashion the sheath, the A-line dress, and the turtleneck for men (as well as the Nehru jacket). Cassini was the first high fashion designer to produce colored dress shirts for men. Wood framed artwork consisting of an embossed relief on bleached pulp paper of Prince George's downtown skyline and the Cutbanks geological feature. Attached placard featuring the City of Prince George Coat of Arms and the following text: "Iona Campagnolo: With thanks for the many years of service you have given to the people of Prince George, B.C., September 2001".</p> <p>Symbolism: City of Prince George Coat of Arms</p> <div data-bbox="378 646 597 898" data-label="Image"> </div> <p>The Shield: The colours blue and gold were chosen since blue suggests the waters of the rivers and gold the wealth and prosperity of the City and its region. The two wavy bars are a reference to the rivers - Fraser and Nechako - flowing together. Above are two snowflake crystals which tie in with the motto of the city, central to British Columbia, through which the development of the north is taking place. In the base or point of the shield is the "fraise". This was intended as a play on the name of the founder, Simon Fraser. The same heraldic charge may be seen in the coats of arms of Simon Fraser University and in the District of Coquitlam for the same reason.</p> <p>The Crest: The Crest rises above the shield of arms. Here the mural crown was intended as a reference to the City's status. It looks back to the middle ages when all important cities were surrounded by a fortified wall. The railway wheel recalls the arrival of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway in 1914 and the British Columbia Railway in 1952. The moose head is a symbol favoured by the citizens and long used by the City.</p> <p>The Compartment and Supporters: The word compartment refers to the grassy mount upon which the supporters stand. It rises from blue and white wavy bars, a standard method of representing water in heraldry, and together with the salmon are yet another reference to the rivers. The Compartment is strewn with branches and flowers of local flora. The eagle and the osprey are local to the area. To make each of the latter unique to Prince George they are "differenced" in this case by having their wings divided between the two colours. The partition or dividing line is described in heraldry as "embattled" as a reference to "Fort" George. In addition, each bird wears a ducal coronet, a reminder that the name of the City was changed in 1915 to honour His Royal Highness Prince George, Duke of Kent the fourth son of King George V and as such a descendant of King George III in whose reign the City was founded. Lieutenant Governor of British Columbia Car flag featuring the Crest of the Lieutenant Governor of British Columbia. Such car flags were referred to as "Battleflags"; this was one of five such car flags used during provincial tours. The Lieutenant Governor's Flag is a royal blue flag with the shield of arms of British Columbia in its centre, surrounded by a circlet of 10 gold stylized maple leaves representing the 10 Provinces of Canada. Above the shield is a St. Edward's Crown, signifying the Sovereign's representative in the Province. The flag was approved by the Governor General on behalf of Her Majesty The Queen on February 1, 1982. When the Lieutenant Governor is present, the flag is flown at public buildings, Canadian Forces' establishments, the Parliament Buildings, on Her Majesty's Canadian Ships and at Government House. (taken from http://www.ltgov.bc.ca/ltgov/symbols.htm)</p> <p>Shield Symbolism: The crest representing the Lieutenant Governor of British Columbia is actually based upon the provincial flag of British Columbia as it appears its shield of arms form. The B.C. provincial flag is horizontally divided, bearing an elongated Union Jack emblem in its upper half and wavy stripes of white and blue and a stylized portion of the sun in its lower half. In the centre of the Union Jack is a golden crown.</p>  <p>A new seal was established in 1896 for British Columbia, based on a design by the clergyman Arthur John Beanlands. To emphasize loyalty to Great Britain, he placed the Union Jack on a shield; the maritime nature of British Columbia was reflected in the wavy white and blue stripes in the chief (upper part of the shield). Beanlands used the stylized sun on the stripes to refer to the far west location of British Columbia. The provincial motto, "Splendor sine occasu" ("Splendour without setting" or "Splendour without diminishment"), was set below the shield. In the royal warrant of March 31, 1906, the Union Jack and the stripes were reversed: the chief (upper part) now bears the Union Jack while the blue and white stripes fill the rest of the shield. In addition the warrant added an "antique crown" at the centre of the Union Jack.</p> <p>Some 60 years later, Premier William Andrew Cecil Bennett learned that the 1906 grant of arms allowed the shield to be transformed directly into a flag and that this usage was supported by heraldic law. His government thus avoided political debate about the propriety of any proposed design. An order in council established this armorial banner for British Columbia on June 20, 1960; however, the horizontal shape of the flag meant that the Union Jack of the arms stretched more than twice its normal length while the sun and stripes were similarly distorted. 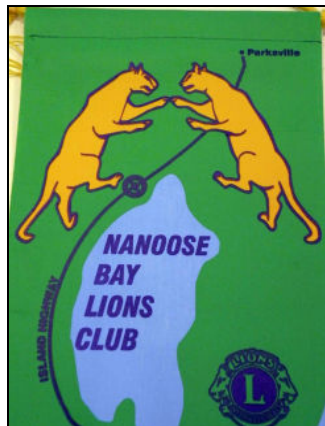

They adhere to the mission statement of Lions Club International which is "to create and foster a spirit of understanding among all people for humanitarian needs by providing voluntary service through community involvement and international co-operation." They are part of Lions Clubs International in Multiple District 19, which includes clubs in British Columbia, Washington, and Northern Idaho. We are in District "I" which encompasses Vancouver Island BC and Olympic Peninsula WA. We are in Zone 7 which also includes: Alberni Valley, Gabriola Island, Nanaimo, Nanaimo - Hub City, Parksville, Parksville Lioness, and Protections Island Lions Clubs.
