FONDS LEVEL DESCRIPTION**The Walt Taylor fonds, 1951-2001.**

5.11m of textual records

Born in Longmont, Colorado on 10 March 1919, environmentalist and social activist Walter (Walt) Taylor devoted a lifetime in the U.S.A. and Canada to the cultivation of peace with justice. During World War II he served in work camps as a conscientious objector to war, but ultimately went to prison for his stand against conscription. He turned away from graduate study in Physics to take a Master's degree in Human Development at the University of Chicago.

With four children in their family, he and his wife Margaret (Peggy) Taylor (b. Lewiston, Maine, 7 August 1916) worked in a variety of social services, but were always seeking opportunities to encourage a fundamental movement toward peace with justice and sustainable environmental stewardship.

In the 1960s Philadelphia Quakers sent Walt as their response to a request from the Seneca Nation of Native Americans for help in defending the oldest active treaty in American history, the Treaty of Canandaigua which had been firmly negotiated with the Seneca Nation in 1794. In spite of a great nationwide protest, that treaty was violated by the construction of the controversial Kinzua Dam (1961-1965) on the Allegheny River which flooded 10,000 acres of land and displaced 600 Seneca families out of their traditional territory. After moving to Summerland, British Columbia during the Vietnam War, Walt continued his active interest in the concerns of First Nations peoples and even worked for the Union of B.C. Indian Chiefs in the 1970s.

Beginning in 1973 and running for several years thereafter, Walt directed an innovative project called "Imagine Penticton" through which the whole community of Penticton was invited to imagine itself the way *it ought to be* and to join Walt and his staff in bringing this collective vision to fruition. Taylor was also actively involved with the South Okanagan Civil Liberties Society, the South Okanagan Environmental Coalition and the Southern Interior Ecological Liaison – venues which allowed him to further his passionate advocacy for justice, peace and environmental sustainability.

His time in the Okanagan region of B.C., also provided Walt Taylor with the opportunity to become heavily involved with the *British Columbia Man and Resources Programme* – a 2 year public participation programme sponsored and organized by the Canadian Council of Resource and Environment Ministers (CCREM). The *Man and Resources Programme* originated in 1961 when natural resource ministers from across the country met at the "Resources for Tomorrow" Conference to discuss a natural resources policy for Canada. At that time, public interest in resource issues was low, so the main results from that conference were strictly governmental and technical. *Man and Resources* was concerned with all aspects of the environmental problem – social, economic, ecological – but it also sought to involve *all* Canadians in its investigation; therefore one of the fundamental goals of this Programme was to enlist citizen participation to discuss the whole question of development and the use of resources and how that should be balanced against protection of the environment. This mandate was to be accomplished through two phases: Phase I was undertaken in 1972 when community representatives from across the province came together locally, then regionally (Delta, B.C., Sept. 23-23, 1972) and finally nationally (Montebello, Q.C., Oct. 29-Nov. 4, 1972) to take on the task of problem identification. In 1973, Phase II was undertaken which required citizen participants to identify solutions and alternatives to the problems identified at the national conference at Montebello in 1972. The provincial conference was held in Naramata, B.C., September 20-23, 1973 while the national conference was held in Toronto, Nov.18-23, 1973.

In 1982 Walt and his family moved north to Smithers, B.C. where he continued to dedicate his life to grass-roots level, political and environmental activism in the Bulkley Valley - Telkwa - Smithers area. For the next eighteen years Walt Taylor, and his wife Peggy, were actively involved with the Northwest Study Conference Society, the Skeena Round Table on Sustainable Development, the Waging Peace Society, Project Ploughshares – Smithers, the Smithers Human Rights Society, the Gitksan-Carrier Tribal Council, the Gitksan-Wet'suwet'en Tribal Council, the Telkwa Educational Action Committee of Householders, the Bulkley Valley Anti-Poverty Group, and the Smithers Social Planning Committee, to name a few, through which they promoted a wide range of social rights causes including global peace, human rights and environmental sustainability to peoples, organizations and communities throughout Northern B.C.

The Northwest Study Conference Society (NWSCS), as mentioned above, was one of many organizations with which Walt and Peggy Taylor were fundamentally involved. The Society's Constitution, adopted on February 23, 1983, outlines the Society's primary objectives as follows:

- To promote regional self determination by people of northwest B.C. in order to protect their fundamental human rights and dignity by increasing their influence in decision making;
- To unite labour, Native, women, environmental and church organizations and other socially conscious peoples;
- To foster a harmonious, non-restrictive approach for the development of full human potential regardless of age, sex, race, religious or political beliefs;
- To encourage regional economic self determination stressing development of full and meaningful employment in a safe and healthy environment;
- To encourage direct local participation in the development and delivery of social services;
- To promote artistic, scientific and educational welfare of the people of the northwest;
- To develop an information network to facilitate active communication between citizens and groups in northwest B.C.; and
- To improve public awareness of the close connection between regional well-being and the safety, health, human rights, culture and dignity of people throughout the world.

The NWSCS brought many public interest groups together in Terrace, B.C. in 1975, 1982 and again in 1984. Each conference produced significant resolutions, expanding networks and stronger appreciation of the benefits of cooperation among many varied but interdependent interests. At the AGM on Feb. 14, 1987, members voted unanimously to move beyond conference resolutions and into action. The NWSCS approved the concept of "Employment Northwest (Waging Peace)" as their "Project Number One". On March 28, 1987 further plans were considered and an additional approach was introduced incorporating bioregional principles. By May 3, however, NWSCS members found themselves inundated by other pressures that demanded their immediate attention, such as the provincial labour legislation, and the court action taken by Gitksan and Wet'suwet'en hereditary chiefs. As a result it was determined that the Society did not have people available at that time to help develop Waging Peace into a pilot project in Northwest B.C. The Society did, however, strongly encourage Walt Taylor to continue exploring ways to revise the draft proposal into an active demonstration project in one or more Canadian communities where people could be assured of vigorous support from many other cooperating communities.

The encouragement offered by the NWSCA and the concept of the Waging Peace project ultimately lead to the incorporation of the "Waging Peace Society" (WPS) of which Walter Taylor was the founding president. Incorporated on July 26, 1993, the purpose of the WPS was to foster full employment doing all the necessary "new work" and stimulating ecological ways of doing "old work" to keep Earth habitable and life worth living for our own and future generations. The main environmental services, or activities, provided by the WPS included the research and preparation of two tools deemed necessary for significant

progress toward full employment in appropriate work for a sustainable society in the twenty-first century. These two tools included: 1) *a work inventory* - an inventory of necessary new work and ways of doing old work without exceeding the finite limits of the earth's capacity to regenerate its natural resources and to assimilate waste; and 2) *a financial support inventory* - an inventory of innovative ways to support this high priority work financially so that those who do the work can earn a living at it. It was the intention of the WPS to demonstrate the use of these tools, once developed, at the local level and then spread this application internationally. While the primary objectives of the WPS never did reach fruition, they did find manifestation in Walt Taylor's publication *Waging Peace for a Living: An Action Plan for Survival of Life on Earth* published by Trafford Publishing in 1999.

The Skeena Round Table for a Sustainable Society was another organization with which Walt Taylor was intrinsically involved. The Round Table was a grass-roots organization formed in October 1989 in response to Provincial Task Force recommendations which sought to bring together perspectives from industry, commerce, resource development, environmental organizations, tourism, aboriginal communities and government agencies on how to better integrate the environment and the economy. The Society's overarching goal was to foster improved public understanding of the facts surrounding important issues in the Skeena watershed and it strived to reach these goals through the following four primary activities:

- To research and provide public disclosure of the facts about priority resource issues and conflicts to assist in better public decision making;
- To develop public education materials on sustainable development;
- To encourage improved inventory of resources; and
- To identify and encourage economic development opportunities in the drainage basin which can achieve the principles of sustainability and high employment.

The Round Table functioned through subcommittees which sought to examine key areas of concern such as studying and reporting on topics in forest management. Another such subcommittee, the Employment Subcommittee, developed an action plan to identify and carry out the work required to effect the necessary transition from non-sustainable to sustainable ways of living and earning a living in the Skeena watershed, and to do that region's share of the necessary work toward a sustainable global society. The Round Table extended itself across a huge geographical area; it operated with very little money and no staff. This reality combined with virtually no recognition or encouragement by the B.C. Round Table on the Environment and Development or CORE, or the provincial government, permitted the Skeena Round Table to ultimately lose both its momentum and many of its leaders, including Walt Taylor.

On February 17, 1990, with letters of endorsement from the Smithers Human Rights Society, Tools for Peace, Northwest Development Education Association and *The Interior News* in hand, Walt Taylor traveled to Nicaragua to observe their historic election process which ousted the revolutionary Sandinista government from power. Upon his return on March 3, 1990, he embarked upon local speaking engagements and wrote numerous articles for *The Interior News* in order to share this momentous experience with his community. Mr. Taylor's speaking engagements were sponsored by Project Ploughshares – Smithers, one of forty working groups of Canadians sponsored by the Canadian Council of Churches and supported by churches, development agencies and other concerned groups and individuals. The organization encourages Canadians to examine the causes and consequences of Canadian Military policies and Canada's participation in global militarism, seeking Canadian policies that prepare for peace, not war.

In 1993 Walt appeared as a witness on behalf of the Smithers Human Rights Society, to the Select Standing Committee on Economic Development, Science, Labour Training and Technology regarding the North America Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). This Standing Committee had been empowered to

examine and report on the implications for the economies of British Columbia and Canada of NAFTA initiated by Canada, the United States, and Mexico on October 7, 1992.

In October 1999, in his capacity as President of the Waging Peace Society, member of the Bulkley Valley Anti-Poverty Group and author of the then newly published *Waging Peace for a Living*, Walter Taylor made a presentation to the Select Standing Committee on Agriculture and Fisheries on the topic of their investigation: agrifood policy for the new millennium and beyond for British Columbia. The premise of his presentation focused primarily upon the question: “how to identify and carry out the enormous amount of work that is required to restore health to our planet and to provide opportunities for survival of life on earth for our own and future generations”.¹

In 2000, Walter and Peggy Taylor moved backed to the United States where they settled in Eugene, Oregon; Walt Taylor died in 2002, his wife Peggy in 2009.

Custodial History:

The records of Walt Taylor were transferred directly from his family home in Smithers, B.C. to the Northern B.C. Archives & Special Collections at the University of Northern British Columbia in Prince George, B.C. in two separate donations. The first donation was received directly from the Taylors on August 21, 2000, with the second donation arriving from Smithers via a family member in June 2002.

Scope and Content:

This fonds illustrates Walt Taylor’s activities as a social activist in the Okanagan region of B.C. in the 1970s, and his involvement with political-environmental activist movements in the Bulkley Valley-Telkwa-Smithers area c.1980s-1990s. The *Taylor fonds* includes records of the Skeena Round Table for a Sustainable Society, the Northwest Study Conference Society and the *Waging Peace Society*; as well as, background research compiled for Taylor’s publication *Waging Peace for a Living: An Action Plan for survival of life on earth*, (Victoria: Trafford Publishing, 1999). The *Taylor fonds* also contains records of significance relating to proposed economic developments, such as open-pit mining, fishing and forestry policies and nuclear power; and documents pertaining to political-environmental actions conducted by Northern BC stakeholders such as First Nations (Gitskan and Wet’su’wet’en) and NGO’s such as the Telkwa Educational Action Committee of Householders. Types of records comprising this fonds include correspondence to/from activist organizations; circulars to society members; background papers on social activist issues; background reports on BC First Nations environmental and land claims issues, background studies on environmental & economic impacts of industrial developments proposed for Northern BC, newspaper clippings, and various publications. The *Walt Taylor fonds* has been divided into the following 5 series:
